Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

This letter is to inform you the Corona-Norco USD, in conjunction with our local water agencies, has tested lead levels in drinking water at all CNUSD school sites in compliance with Assembly Bill 746.

Please be advised testing for your school site took place in January 2019, and results show there was **no detection** of lead. To view the results, please visit www.cnusd.k12.ca.us/watertesting.

To further safeguard water quality in California's K-12 public schools, California Assembly Bill 746 requires community water systems to test lead levels in drinking water at all California public, K-12 school sites that were constructed before January 1, 2010. While state law only requires that schools built before 2010 be tested, CNUSD has taken this opportunity to collaborate with our water agencies and test all CNUSD school sites to ensure the highest water quality for all of our students and staff.

A location is listed as "Above Action Level" if a drinking water sample taken at that location produced a test result of greater than 15 parts per billion (ppb), which is the action level established by the State Water Resources Control Board and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. All drinking water outlets where lead is identified above the State's action level of 15 ppb have been secured until remediation was complete. One part per billion is equivalent to about one drop in an Olympic-sized swimming pool. Again, out of an abundance of caution CNUSD has tested all school sites.
